## 2. OBJECTIVE AND TASKS OF THE «INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION PROCESSES» COURSE

- **2.1. Purpose of the discipline** «International Migration Processes» is to develop knowledge and skills in the field of international migration processes regulation, to identify their causes, challenges and possibilities for destination cities of immigrants who seek job, housing or want to receive tourism or educational services.
- 2.2. The tasks in discipline «International integration processes» learning are to discover students the features of international migration processes, the goals pursued by migrants and the consequences for both of donor and recipient countries respectively of the departure and the arrival of migrants, as well as the opportunities and challenges arising from the flows of refugees and asylum seekers, and as well as the need to form EU countries common migration policy as a result of illegal and legal flows of migrants and the wave of refugees.
- **2.3.** As a result of studying the discipline «International Migration Processes» the student should **know**:
  - migration flows and peculiarities of its regulation;
- evolution of labor force World markets development and causes attractiveness of destination cities for migrants;
  - migration challenges for destination cities;
  - causes and consequences of refugee flows irregular;
- peculiarities of Immigration policy of EU countries on boundaries crossing by immigrants;
  - rights and duties of migrants;
- immigrants flows in tourism and education sphere, features of their departure, arrival, staying, control border and residence.

CPIT covers all major topics of discipline **«International migration processes»**. The purpose of CPIT is depth study of the most issues in international integration processes. Preparation of CPIT is one mandatory component of modules test credit in the subject **«International migration processes»**:

- **Step 1.** Choose country in order to estimate migration processes.
- **Step 2.** Analyze of migrants inflows and outflows of chosen country.

## 6. CRITERIA ASSESSMENT COMPLEX PRACTICAL INDIVIDUAL TASK AND TRAINING OF THE DISCIPLINE «INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION PROCESSES» ACCORDING TO THE CREDIT-MODULE SYSTEM

When evaluating a complex practical individual task and training in the discipline «Iternational migration processes», taking into account the quality of its conducting, the adequacy of the information base in order to analyze, the design according to the requirements, the student's ability to connect theoretical knowledge with practice, the completeness and accuracy of answers to questions, and as well as the student's ability to conduct a reasoned public debate and defend his/her position, etc.

Evaluating CPIT and the student's training performance, first of all, attention is paid how fluently and confidently the speaker possesses the material of his/her individual task and can explain the materials of tables, figures, diagrams, etc.

The CPIT and training performance is evaluated according to a four-point system («excellent», «good», «satisfactory», «unsatisfactory») and scores according to the credit-module system (ECTC).

The grade «excellent» – A (90–100) deserves a student who has completed the CPIT and training in compliance with all the requirements; carried out depth systematic study; during the defense of his/her work (report) he/she demonstrated fluency in the material, the ability to think creatively and conduct reasoned polemics.

The grade (300) - B (85–89) is given in the presence of minor deficiencies in the CPIT and training performance and its design; CPIT and training were performed at an appropriate analytical level, although there are some shortcomings of an unprincipled nature, and the performers of CPIT and training during the defense demonstrated depth knowledge of the problem, the ability to think creatively, as well as analytically and discuss.

The grade of (900) - C (75–84) is awarded to a student who independently and in accordance with the schedule carried out indicators research of migration flows; insufficiently used informational materials on the object of the research and superficially carried out an analytical, comparative analysis and developed proposals;

during the CPIT and the training defence a student demonstrated a good mastery of the problem.

The mark «satisfactory» – D (64–74) is given if the CPIT and training are mostly completed, but there are shortcomings of a substantive nature: descriptive nature, insufficiently analyzed and presented patterns and trends of international migration development; solutions and proposals are insufficiently substantiated; during the defense a performers of CPIT and training demonstrated mostly satisfactory mastery of the problem and low analytical thinking, and not all answers to the questions were correct and complete.

The mark «sufficient» – E (60–64) is given to students who have completed the CPIT and training in accordance with the schedule, but mainly their presentation has descriptive nature, and during the defense of the work they demonstrated a low level of knowledge.

The mark «unsatisfactory» – FX (35–59) is given in case the violation of the schedule of CPIT and training defence; non-compliance with the requirements of design and presentation; CPIT and training are done superficially and have the following shortcomings: no analysis, the descriptive character; ways of the problems solving are either absent or inconsistent with the results of the conducted research; a student gives inaccurate or incomplete answers to questions during the CPIT and training defence.
